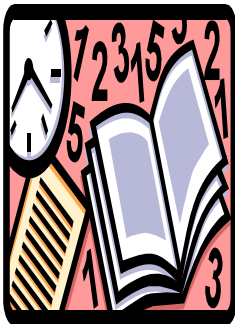

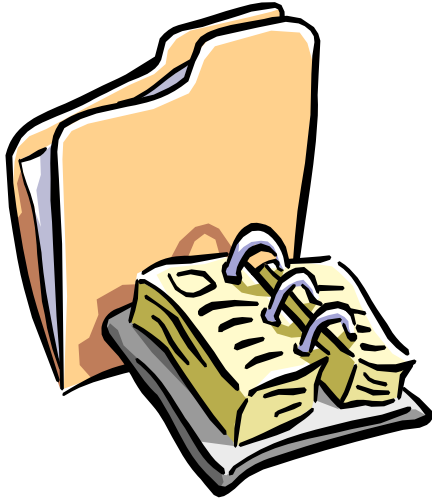

## From the Pastor



This year New Year's Day falls on a Sunday, which, on the church calendar is designated as "The Name of Jesus." The story from the Gospel of Luke is a clear reminder of the significant in-breaking of the Good News of God as incarnated in Jesus. The delight of Mary and Joseph and the shepherds was contagious. The birth of Jesus elicited amazement, wonder, and praise, even prompting a blessing from old Simeon who declared that Jesus was "a light for revelation to the Gentiles and for glory to the people Israel."

As I reflect on the Luke narrative, and the delight displayed by those who were close to Jesus, I can't help but think of

the children and young people within our own congregation who have caused delight among us.

Think back to the pure and holy voices of the Sunday School children singing at the Christmas program, the energetic caroling of the youth group in the Sunrise East neighborhood, and the heartfelt singing at the Christmas Eve service. Pause and reflect on the delightful dancing in the aisle of little Annabelle Ellington while the congregation sang "Joy to the World!" or the beaming smile of Holden Bonwell as he proudly held the communion cup basket.

These are just samples of how children and youth witness to the rest of us with the joy of God's goodness. My prayer is that we adults will convey to them just how important their witness is...how their participation in worship, fellowship, service, etc. is not only important to them, but to the whole congregation. Thank the parents, too, who faithfully bring their children and youth to worship and encourage them to become full participants in the body of Christ.

May the new year bring you peace and joy and may the children of our heavenly Father bring you continued delight – just as Jesus still brings joy to the world.

**LOOKING AHEAD:** Beginning on February 12th, the Sunday Adult Forums will continue with the study on Luther: Gospel, Law and Reformation.

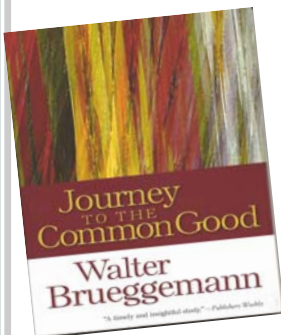
### Journey to the Common Good

This particular study will run 6-8 weeks.

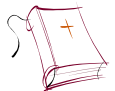

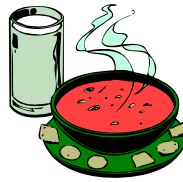

## STEWARD OF THE MONTH BETTY HALL



A couple years ago an annual congregational meeting prompted many members to take a deep look at the significance of supporting the mission of Celebration Lutheran. For many the discussion surrounding the annual budget was a “kairos” moment, recognizing that the budget represented more than a bunch of numbers. Instead it represented key ministry opportunities.

Betty Hall was touched by the discussion and approached me afterward – lamenting on the one hand how it would be difficult for her to increase her contribution to the ministries of CLC on a fixed income, but on the other hand promising to find a way to do so because of how much the church meant to her.

Betty doesn’t remember much of this conversation...but I certainly do. It was indicative of the love she has for the church and for the ongoing ministry of Jesus. She and her late husband, Harold, were charter members of CLC and were instrumental in its growth from the beginning.

Betty grew up in Menomonie, Wisconsin and was a member of Our Savior Lutheran church. A life-long Lutheran, she was active in Confirmation, Luther League, and all kinds of ministries. Participating in church activities was a way of life and perhaps a “not-so-subtle” way of impressing that fact upon her, her parents always had the family sit in the front pew! Church was front and center!

Her response to what it means to be a steward reflects that sentiment: taking part in what the church offers, volunteering and stepping up to the plate when things need attention, greeting new people and making them feel welcome.

While Betty’s health hasn’t been great the last few years, her faithful participation in worship is always an inspiration to others. For those who remember her late husband, Harold, you know what an inspiration he was as well. Harold was an extremely benevolent man, constantly lifting up the lives of others by his graciousness. I can’t count the number of times he helped diagnose and fix my vehicles. He also had a heart for the church. Just a few months before he died, he helped apply the coating on the knotty pine boards that eventually became our beautiful ceiling. Think of Harold when you gaze upward during worship!
